PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents/Carers,

ASH WEDNESDAY

<u>Next Wednesday, 17th February</u>, is Ash Wednesday. On this special day we receive ashes placed on our forehead which remind us of our mortality and symbolize the spirit of Penance. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent.

LENT

The church has set aside certain times throughout the year to help us remember particular events in the life of Jesus, and to remind us of who we are and what we are called to do. Over the coming year the mystery of Christ is unfolded from his birth through to his Ascension and to Pentecost. Lent is a time of reflection and repentance. It is a time for us to renew our faith commitment to God.

EUCHARIST PARENT INFORMATION EVENING

This will be held <u>next Thursday 18th February in the Hall beginning at 7pm.</u> Information has been sent home to families involved with the Eucharist program this year.

VPASS

The school has an iPad cloud based registration system [VPASS] which improves student security and safety across the school.

VPASS registers and monitors every adult visitor on the school site. With 'COVID normal' conditions we are limited to the number of adults we can have on the property however VPASS provides the school with access to visitor information anytime from anywhere. It also provides vital information relating to evacuations/lockdowns and provides custom identification for different groups e.g. staff, parents, visitors, volunteers, workmen.

The VPASS iPad is located at the School Office. Visitors are required to log into the VPASS system when they arrive and log out of the system when they leave. Visitors will receive a specific coloured lanyard to wear around the school which will identify who they are and that they have successfully signed into the school.

We will continue to monitor our students and staff as closely as possible and follow the guidelines from Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools [MACS].

Final dismissal is at 3.20pm and staff will supervise the school exit points for 20 minutes after dismissal.

Please note that during this time of 'COVID normal' our dismissal time can change depending on recommendations from the State Government and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools [MACS]. Families will be notified of any changes to the end of the day procedures.

A Dwelling Apart

Here's something curious: the leper and Jesus trade places in the story. At first, it's the leper who's forced into the wild by communal dread of his disease. In the end, it's Jesus who must retreat to the desert to avoid the crush of crowds brought on by publicity.

Biblical desert is a land of many facets. Literally, it's a place where life is challenging and death is near. Theologically, it's the domain of the devil, where temptation roams free. Both physical and spiritual realities of the desert made it a place to avoid when possible. To be sentenced to live there, with lepers and other outlaws, was a lonely and dangerous existence.



Yet Jesus, we know, often chose the desert. The Spirit first drove him there to test himself against the devil. Later, Jesus often returned there to pray and gather strength. Because he tamed the desert at the start of his journey, it was no longer a land of danger for Jesus, but a refuge. In the same way, we can surrender the desert terrain of our lives to the Spirit's authority, and let it be transformed into a sacred place.

Where are the desert areas in your life? How can you be transformed?

Find a place apart where you can sit in stillness or walk in solitude. Bring nothing with you and don't "fill up" the time and space with an agenda. Wait for Jesus to come and join you.

Go as the young servant of Naaman this day, filled with the truth of the prophet's word that there is healing for the least and the greatest among us. Speak peace, teach kindness, be glad. May God's blessings attend you this and every day. You are not alone. Go in peace. Amen.

Books are now available for children to borrow from school for Home Reading. It is important for children to read each night, and for children in Grades 3 - 6 it is an expectation that they record their reading in their school diary. Children may write what pages they have read, the title and even a short summary of the book if they wish. Encourage your child to read aloud to you and ask questions about the books they read. Remember too that all reading is valuable, whether it is a book a magazine or even the newspaper.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
